DIRECTIONS TO MINGUS MOUNTAIN UNITED METHODIST CAMP

- o Take **Interstate 17 North** to exit 262 toward Prescott (Route 69 North).
- Make a slight left onto AZ 69 North.
- o Head North on AZ 69
- o At the **AZ 69/Fain Rd.** intersection, turn right. (the Fain intersection is at the entrance to the Prescott Golf Club which is on the left).
- o Travel 9 miles to the lighted intersection of AZ 69 and **AZ 89A**.
- o Turn Right onto **North AZ 89A**. (Travel approx. 12 miles on 89A. Follow the MINGUS RECREATION AREAS signs as you travel the last few miles before the summit, located between mile markers 336 and 337)
- o Turn Right onto dirt road FSR 104 (Forest Service Road) straight up 2.5 miles to the Mingus Mountain UM Camp. Signage indicates CAMP MINGUS 2 miles.

DO NOT follow signage to Mingus Springs Camp

Mingus Camp is on the **left** side of the road just beyond a small fishing lake. You will be directed to the second entry road. An information kiosk will show the location of our cabin.

Once you unload your vehicle at the cabin, cars <u>must</u> be parked in the <u>parking lot at the entrance</u>. Cars must also be <u>BACKED IN</u> per Forest Service rules.
